

## TITCHFIELD NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM NEWSLETTER 26.04.18.

### The Neighbourhood Plan

The Plan is currently with Fareham Borough Council who are looking at it informally for us following a 'Health Check' by the Government. It is due back on 30<sup>th</sup> April. We will then make any necessary changes.

A public consultation of the Plan will then start at the Village Fete on 12<sup>th</sup> May where Forum members will be available to answer your questions and for you to look at the display in our gazebo. The Plan will be posted on our website where you will be able to comment [www.titchfieldmatters.org.uk](http://www.titchfieldmatters.org.uk)

We are also proposing to have a 6-week permanent exhibition, plus open sessions for you to ask questions during this period - watch this space for times, venues and dates. Final changes to the Plan will then be made.

Following the 6 week public consultation, during which time FBC will also look at it formally, the Plan will be amended to reflect public comments before going to the approved inspector. There will then be a referendum of the residents of the Plan area.

### Posbrook Lane Development

Foreman Homes, the developer, has submitted an appeal against the decision to reject their planning application. If you didn't object before, you can do so now but if you did object and wish to add anything to your previous objections please do so - see post on website.

### Village Emblem

Following the initial community consultation of the Titchfield Neighbourhood Forum there was a suggestion that an emblem or logo to represent the village would be desirable. Sean Seawright, on behalf of the Forum, took on this task. Sean's team was Chris Cook, an artist and sign-maker, Stephen Smith a local computer consultant and Ken Groves, a village historian. Their aim was to produce a '**Symbolic Identity for the Ancient**

**History of Titchfield**'. The logo and 'mocked-up' street sign show the progress they have made so far. Now it is up to the residents of Titchfield to say what they think before any further progress can be made. There will be a display in the St Peter's Church during the village fete.
